

WORKSHOP WITH ANNE METTE FRIIS: STUDENT VOICE AND BEST PRACTICE

1st January 2024 Denmark passed a new law (Barnets Lov) which has been designed to strengthen the rights of the child and the child's voice across many areas. A best practice model developed by Northern Irish, Laura Lundy, reflected in this law now forms the basis for practice across education and child services in Denmark.

On **Thursday 24th October**, we have invited Anne Mette Friis, who has spent more than 20 years of her career campaigning for children's rights. She can offer perspectives from, among other, her time as a teacher, UNICEF director for Denmark. Currently Anne Mette serves on the boards of Save the Children and Child and Youth Friendly Governance Project, where Laura Lundy is an honorary member.
